- a) Retaining the identity of the library, which is one of the leading, and perhaps the only remaining, topographical library run by a local trust rather than being in public or university ownership left in Britain,
- b) The creation of the Salt Club which could help in improving access to the collection and stimulate new membership for the Friends, and
- c) The use of the Trustees' Room as a 'break-out area' that could retain some books: whilst the new Salt Library section in the new building would take the more valuable items, there is scope for further books to be displayed elsewhere, and we would like to suggest that the Trustees and the Friends be involved in developing the policy for this.

We wish the Trustees and the Archive Service a successful outcome in this 'once in a generation opportunity'.
